The EM Care Team recently set up street booths throughout November 2025 in Wan Chai, Central & Western, and Southern district to educate ethnic minority communities on how Hong Kong's voting system works and to raise awareness about the importance of participation.

These efforts helped community members better understand the electoral process, empowering them to make informed decisions and strengthening their voice in society. By fostering inclusion and awareness, the initiative supports equal representation and active citizenship.


At the end, some of the kids performed popular Bollywood songs and the event ended up with tasting Indians traditional sweets.

Throughout the workshop, the children learned how to present themselves with good preparation for the interview. Moreover, they gained valuable insights into the choices they have for secondary schools as well as what to do in certain situations of application.

RECENT ACTIVITIES

ADULT INTERNSHIP PROGRAMME 2025: EMPOWERING NEW ARRIVALS

From September to October 2025, HOPE Centre launched a brand-new adult internship programme aimed at enhancing opportunities for ethnic minority new arrivals. This initiative provided participants with professional work experience while supporting their integration into Hong Kong's workplace culture.

Three interns successfully completed 160 hours each, gaining practical experience in administration, computer skills, communication, and accountability. They learned about professional expectations and workplace culture, creating a unique cycle of ethnic minorities supporting each other.

This pilot programme marks a significant step in HOPE Centre's mission to empower ethnic minority communities through professional development and meaningful employment pathways.



ISS-HK HOPE CENTRE DRAGON BOAT COMPETITION



On 16 November 2025, the HOPE Centre team proudly competed in the Black Warrior Charity Mid-Autumn Festival Dragon Boat Cup 2025, organised by the Sports Association for the Blind - Darkness Fighters, at Stanley Beach. The team raced alongside local dragon boat teams—including NGOs, government departments, and private companies,

STRENGTHENING SCHOOL COLLABORATIONS AND EDUCATIONAL RESOURCES FOR ETHNIC MINORITY

On 27 September and 8 November 2025, HOPE Centre hosted parent talks featuring the Vice Principal of CCC Kwai Wah Shan Secondary School and the Principal of St Joan of Arc Secondary School. These sessions aimed to help parents better understand Hong Kong's education system, secondary school allocation, and available resources for Non-Chinese speaking students.

On 18 November 2025, our team conducted a Mindful Parents and Child Activity at Muslim Community Kindergarten. The interactive programme included mindful listening, fun parent-child yoga, emotions exploration, and mindfulness sensory bottle making—strengthening parent-child bonding and nurturing early emotional wellbeing.
