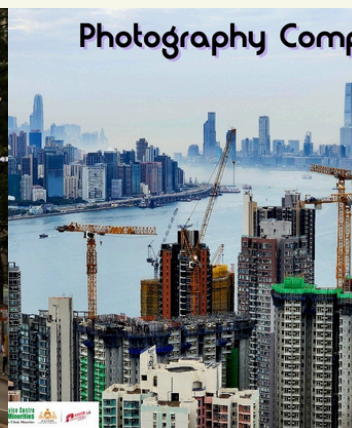


Hong Kong Flower Show

Therapeutic Experience With Dogs

HOPE Centre, takes a holistic approach to child development by addressing both physical and mental wellbeing. We collaborated with Rise Wise to hold a valuable therapeutic experience with dogs for our kids, with a strong focus on their mental health and wellbeing. Through guided interaction, they learned how to approach and understand the body language of dogs, as well as how to play with them appropriately. These sessions were designed to be calming and supportive, and the positive interactions with the dogs had a tangible impact on the children's mental health, promoting relaxation, reducing anxiety, and fostering a sense of connection that is vital for their wellbeing.





Register as an Elector

You are eligible to be registered as an elector if you:

- are aged 18 or above;
- are a Hong Kong permanent resident; and
- ordinarily reside in Hong Kong.

Application deadlines

New registration: 2 June every year

Report on change of particulars: 2 June every year



(Address proofs are required when individuals submit their applications for new registration or applications for change in registered address except for those who are the authorised occupants of public rental housing under the Housing Department or registered residents in the tenancy of subsidised housing under the Hong Kong Housing Society and that the addresses in the tenancy records match the residential addresses provided by them.)

Submission of Forms

Completed and signed application form can be sent to REO:

- (1) by post (address: 29/F, Standard Chartered Tower, Millennium City 1, 388 Kwun Tong Road, Kwun Tong, Kowloon);
- (2) by fax (fax number: 2891 1180);
- (3) by email (email address: form@reo.gov.hk); or
- (4) by uploading the scanned form at the Registration and Electoral Office Online Upload Platform (www.reo-form.gov.hk)

Eligible persons may also submit applications for new registration as geographical constituency electors by using 'iAM Smart+' through 'iAM Smart' mobile App (www.reo.gov.hk/video/voter/GCVRguide-EN.mp4) or online platform (<https://eform.cefs.gov.hk/form/vre001/en/>).

Electors should provide true and accurate information. It is an offence for a person under the Electoral Affairs Commission Regulations to knowingly or recklessly give false or misleading information for voter registration (e.g. false residential address) to the Registration and Electoral Office, and if the person subsequently votes at an election, he/she will also breach the Elections (Corrupt and Illegal Conduct) Ordinance (Cap. 554).

Enquiries

If you do not speak both Chinese and English and wish to make enquiries to REO on matters in relation to voter registration, you may seek assistance from CHEER which provides free of charge over-the-phone interpretation service. You may request the interpreter from CHEER to make a conference call with REO's officer by dialing the REO's enquiry hotline (2891 1001) during REO's office hours from 8:45 a.m. to 6 p.m. from Mondays to Fridays (except public holidays). Once the conference call is connected, you can speak directly to the REO's officer through CHEER's interpreter.

RECENT ACTIVITIES



Guided tour to Light Public Housing

The EM Care Team organised a tour to educate non-Chinese individuals about Light Public Housing (LPH) and help those in urgent need of housing and applicants awaiting public rental housing allocations. The majority of participants said that they were interested in learning more about LPH. Five or six participants got in contact with the housing officer right away to ask for more information before the tour ended. Participants' reaction had been overwhelmingly positive.

Website Design Workshop – for beginners using Canva



In our digital era, having a website is essential for freelancer or business owner. Recognizing this need, we offered a "Website Design Workshop" aimed at enhancing computer skill-development among the ethnic minorities in Hong Kong. Designed for beginners, the workshop simplified the website creation process. Participants learned to create personalized, user-friendly websites through hands-on sessions, gaining insights into design principles and tools like Canva. Overall, the workshop effectively equipped attendees with essential skills for their personal and professional growth.

Bowling for Families

On 12th May 2025, HOPE Centre organized a "Bowling for Families" event at SCAA Bowling Centre in Causeway Bay. It aimed to promote physical fitness while fostering family bonding in a fun, competitive atmosphere. Families enjoyed an hour session of unlimited bowling, engaging in friendly competition as they stayed active together, making it a memorable event for all involved.



Hair Styling

HOPE Centre organized a Hair Styling Workshop to empower participants with valuable beauty skills on 17th and 18th March 2025. The workshop comprised two sessions focused on practical training and hands-on experience. In the first session, a tutor demonstrated techniques for creating a party hairstyle on a mannequin. Participants then practiced on their own hair mannequins, and learnt braiding techniques. The second session taught participants how to use curling irons properly to create perfect bouncy curls. Participants volunteered to try styling their hair, practicing how to hold and use the curling irons effectively.



Baking Training class

On 4th March 2025, HOPE Centre organized its first baking training class for ethnic minority adults, focusing on professional frosting skills. The class aimed to create employment opportunities by teaching essential frosting techniques. Participants learned making frosting from scratch using suitable ingredients and practiced various styles on sponge cakes provided during the session. This hands-on experience helped them develop the skills needed to create professional cakes.

Dress Making

HOPE Centre organized a 3-session sewing class focused on dress making. Participants created maxi long dresses for summer, customized to their preferences. In the first session, participants set up their sewing machines and cut fabric for their dresses. The second and third sessions were dedicated to sewing the dresses. With diverse ethnic backgrounds, each participant crafted a uniquely designed dress. At the end of the workshop, everyone showcased their creations on mannequins, featuring long dresses—some with sleeves and others without.



Nepal New Year Party



HOPE Centre hosted our first Nepal New Year Party to celebrate the coming of 2082 on the Nepal Calendar! 5th April 2025, participants got to feast on Nepali food and snacks, learnt more about the history and culture of Nepal, danced and bonded with other participants to viral music hits, and compete to win in Chungi! Overall, it was a party full of excitement, culture, and fun!



Songkran Festival



Songkran is Thailand's celebration of the New Year and HOPE Centre brought 35 EM participants to Kowloon City to celebrate! Songkran is famous for water splashing, as an act of ritual cleansing, and our participants jumped right into the fun. Aside from the water games, participants also got to watch cultural performances, view art exhibits, and be blessed by fellow celebrators, and enjoy Thai delicacies and activities



Cantonese classes for adults

HOPE Centre offered language classes to support our service users' to learn and integrate into Hong Kong at every stage, from beginners to advanced continuous learners! Since February 2025, HOPE Centre has held 1 basic, 1 intermediate, and 1 advanced Cantonese courses and also have plans for many new upcoming classes starting in June. We have also held 8 fun learning Cantonese short courses for beginners, and participants who have achieved 80% attendance in our fun learning Cantonese course will have priority for enrolment in basic Cantonese class! Chinese Enhancement
